In his return to campus he will present a 20-minute introduction to the discipline of systems engineering. The University of Virginia's Systems & Information Engineering department offers the integration of policy, process, and technology to achieve best outcomes—typically it involves utilization of the results from disparate fields such as industrial engineering, probability and statistics, operations research, ergonomics, economics, and risk analysis. The speaker will discuss opportunities for funding through research or teaching assistantships for each of the degrees offered, research interests of the faculty, and descriptions of classes, as well as a brief outline of his research interests, which lie in healthcare systems engineering and simulation.
