**Part I (Do three problems)**

**I.1.** Let  $g$  be an absolutely continuous monotone function on  $[0, 1]$ , and  $E \subseteq [0, 1]$  a set of Lebesgue measure 0. Prove that  $g(E)$  has measure 0.

**I.2.** Prove that Lebesgue measure  $\lambda$  on  $\mathbb{R}$  is translation invariant: if  $A$  is a Lebesgue measurable subset of  $\mathbb{R}$ , then for each  $u \in \mathbb{R}$ ,  $u + A$  is also Lebesgue measurable and  $\lambda(u + A) = \lambda(A)$ .

**I.3.** Let  $f \in L^1(\mathbb{R})$ . Evaluate

$$\lim_{y \rightarrow \infty} \int_{\mathbb{R}} |f(x + y) - f(x)| dx.$$

Hint: Note that the limit is NOT as  $y \rightarrow 0$ .

**I.4.** A function is said to be **lower semi-continuous** if

$$f(x) \leq \liminf_{n \rightarrow \infty} f(x_n)$$

whenever  $\lim_{n \rightarrow \infty} x_n = x$ . Show that every lower semi-continuous function is Borel measurable.

**Part II (Do two problems)**

**II.1.** Let  $(X, \Sigma, \mu)$  be a measure space and  $\{f_n\}$  a sequence in  $L^1(d\mu)$  which converges a.e. to  $f \in L^1(d\mu)$ . Prove  $f_n \rightarrow f$  in  $L^1(d\mu)$  if and only if  $\int |f_n| d\mu \rightarrow \int |f| d\mu$ .

Hint: Apply Fatou's lemma to  $|f| + |f_n| - |f - f_n|$ .

**II.2.** Let  $(X, \Sigma, \mu)$  be a finite measure space. If  $f$  is integrable, compute and justify the limit

$$\lim_{n \rightarrow \infty} \int_X |f(x)|^{1/n} d\mu(x).$$

**II.3.** Show that the function defined by

$$\phi(t) = \int_{-\infty}^{\infty} \frac{\sin(xt)}{1 + x^4} dx \quad (t \in \mathbb{R})$$

is well-defined and differentiable on  $(0, \infty)$ .
