**Course Goals:** In addition to gaining a deep working understanding of the subject, the student is expected to be able to write clear complete proofs in the subject.

**Topics Covered:** This is the second semester of a two semester sequence in complex analysis. Topics covered in the two semesters include complex differentiation, analytic functions, the Cauchy Integral Formula, Cauchy estimates, maximum and minimum principles, harmonic functions, the Poisson integral formula, the mean value property, the Dirichlet problem, Harnack's inequality; spaces of holomorphic and meromorphic functions, the Riemann Mapping Theorem; analytic continuation; Weierstrass and Hadamard's Factorization Theorems; Picard Theorems; introduction to Riemann Surfaces.

**Course Grading:** Homework will be given frequently. The final grade will be based on the homework, the tests and a final examination.

**Exam Dates:** Tentative dates for partial exams: February 14 and April 11. Final exam date to be determined.

**Attendance Policy:** Attendance is required. Missing four classes implies a failing grade.
